



Adult Education

Fonkoze adult education programs advance the livelihoods of participants by building skills in a collaborative, empowering manner. Fonkoze's adult education courses provide participants with the skills they need in order to respond to their basic needs. At the same time, courses develop qualities of leadership and solidarity among clients.

PROGRAM IMPACT

Over 40% of micro-credit clients are illiterate when they join Fonkoze. Limited education negatively impacts their ability to develop sustainable livelihoods and—especially in a place like Haiti—to recover from shocks such as natural disasters, conflict and climactic variability. Fonkoze relies on peer-based instruction by training select clients to deliver classes to their fellow microfinance clients. Courses include basic literacy and business skills, as well as Ti Koze, a class that invites dialogue on some of the most challenging issues women face in Haiti.

PROGRAM KEY FACTS

- ▶ Fonkoze has been promoting hygiene and sanitation in a region affected by Hurricane Matthew. **3,106 community members** participated in trainings on these topics in 2017.
- ▶ Fonkoze has been providing educational opportunities to its members since 2000, serving over **132,000 participants**.
- ▶ The design of our adult education courses draws on the philosophy of Brazilian educator, Paulo Freire, to **empower** and **educate** the women Fonkoze serves.
- ▶ 13 branch regions offered adult education classes in 2017
