f you have ever visited any part of rural Haiti, then you know how difficult it is to get from one place to another. Unpaved roads, mountainous terrains and rivers in between make traveling in these remote areas seem almost impossible. A mile by car, for example, can take hours depending on the "road" conditions and stoplights are a luxury that typically only exist in big cities like Port-au-Prince.

These obstacles, however, are no match for our resilient, on-the-ground team in Haiti. Their determination and passion for our mission will never cease to amaze me. To reach families living in the Central Plateau, for example, our CLM team will often opt to travel on foot. Even on the hottest days, walking five miles up a mountain seems more practical than driving a vehicle with air conditioning.

When we say, "There is no mountain too high or road too difficult" that will deter our team from trying to bring opportunities of hope and change to vulnerable communities throughout rural Haiti, we mean it. Every day, we are making progress towards our ultimate goal of *eradicating* extreme poverty in rural Haiti.
